

Introduction


International Astronomical Union (IAU)



The IAU is located in Paris, France. This organization was started in 1919. This organization holds a general assembly every three years to discuss and vote all things astronomy.




American Astronomical Society (AAS)


National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA)


SETI Institute


Royal Astronomical Society (RAS)


The Planetary Society
