<b>Content</b>	All of the content throughout the forecast is accurate. There are no factual errors.	Most of the content in the forecast is accurate, but there is one piece of information that is inaccurate.	One to two pieces of content in the forecast are clearly inaccurate.	More than two pieces of information in the forecast are inaccurate.
<b>Organization</b>	The organization of the information in the forecast is logical and in an interesting sequence which audience can follow.	The information in the forecast is in a logical sequence which audience can follow.	The information in the forecast jumps around. While all of the information is present, it is not provided in a sequence that makes sense.	There is no sequence of information in the forecast.
<b>Effectiveness</b>	The forecast includes all material needed to give a good understanding of the weather. The forecast is consistent with the assignment as it is written.	The forecast is lacking one or two key elements. The forecast is consistent with the assignment as it is written most of the time.	The forecast is missing more than two key elements. The forecast is rarely consistent with the assignment as it is written.	The forecast is lacking several key elements and has inaccuracies. The forecast is completely inconsistent with the assignment as it is written.
<b>Mechanics</b>	The forecast is clear and easy to understand. The forecast script and props contain no grammatical or spelling errors. The tone is friendly and inviting.	The forecast is clear and contains valuable information. There are minor grammatical or spelling errors in the scripts or props, but they do not interfere with the quality of the forecast. The tone is friendly and inviting.	The forecast contains little information and is confusing. There are many grammatical or spelling errors in the script and props. The tone is friendly and inviting.	The forecast is disorganized and confusing. There are several grammatical or spelling errors in the scripts or props. The tone is bored or impolite.
<b>Collaboration</b>	The forecast is indicative of a collaborative team effort in which all students have contributed to team meetings and fostered a collaborative environment. It is evident that there was little conflict amongst team members or that conflicts were minimized.			The forecast is indicative of a less-effective collaborative environment in which one or more students did not participate in the development of the project. It is evident that there was conflict or division amongst team members.
