
Economic Causes and Effects

Introduction




Tab Text

Everyone started drinking orange juice instead of milk.




Tab Text

No one ate lunch in the lunch room. Everyone brought their lunch to school.




Tab Text

The government wanted to give everyone free cheese.




Tab Text

Cheese producers would probably not have enough time to make all of the cheese that the government would need to distribute.



A cup of Starbucks[™] coffee went on sale for .25 cents per cup.




Tab Text

The demand for Starbucks[™] coffee would increase. Starbucks[™] would need to produce more coffee for the time period that it was on sale.



Everyone stopped drinking Coca-Cola® and started drinking Pepsi®.




Tab Text

The stores would stop selling Coca-Cola®. Coca-Cola® would need to fire workers. There would be no demand for Coca-Cola®. Pepsi® would probably need to hire more workers to keep up with the amount of Pepsi® that everyone was drinking.
