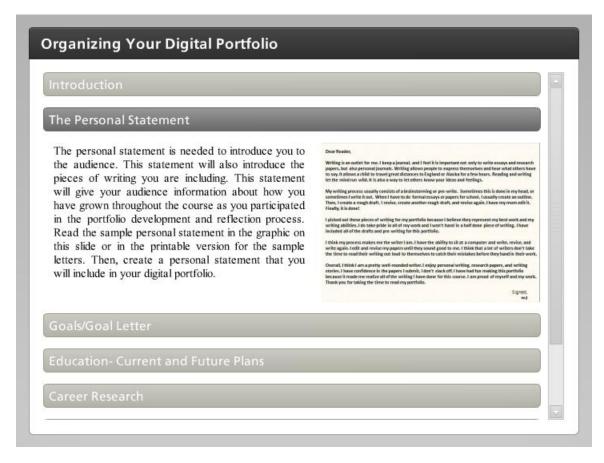
Introduction

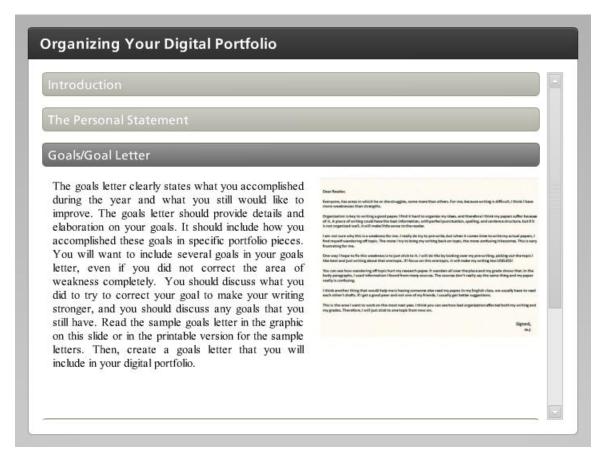
The Personal Statement



The personal statement is needed to introduce you to the audience. This statement will also introduce the pieces of writing you are including. This statement will give your audience information about how you have grown throughout the course as you participated in the portfolio development and reflection process. 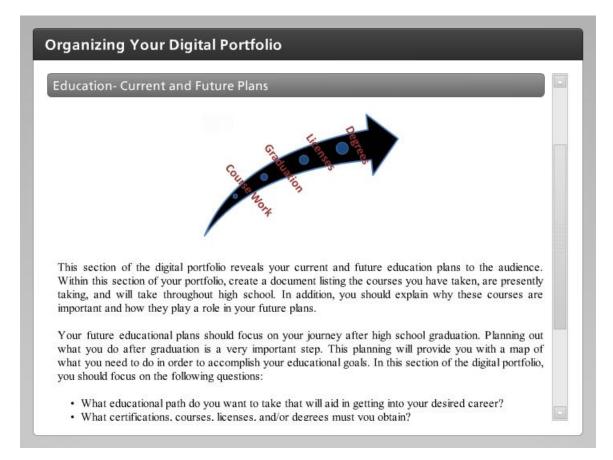
Goals/Goal Letter



The goals letter clearly states what you accomplished during the year and what you still would like to improve. The goals letter should provide details and elaboration on your goals. It should include how you accomplished these goals in specific portfolio pieces. You will want to include several goals in your goals letter, even if you did not correct the area of weakness completely. You should discuss what you did to try to correct your goal to make your writing stronger, and you should discuss any goals that you still have. Education- Current and Future Plans



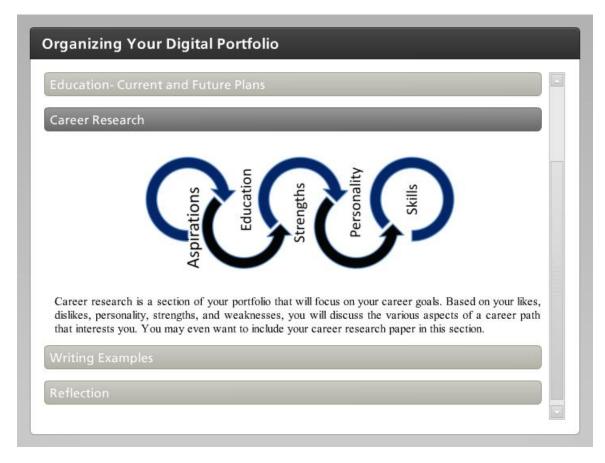
This section of the digital portfolio reveals your current and future education plans to the audience. Within this section of your portfolio, create a document listing the courses you have taken, are presently taking, and will take throughout high school. In addition, you should explain why these courses are important and how they play a role in your future plans.

Your future educational plans should focus on your journey after high school graduation. Planning out what you do after graduation is a very important step. This planning will provide you with a map of what you need to do in order to accomplish your educational goals. In this section of the digital portfolio, you should focus on the following questions:

- What educational path do you want to take that will aid in getting into your desired career?
- What certifications, courses, licenses, and/or degrees must you obtain?



Career Research



Career research is a section of your portfolio that will focus on your career goals. Based on your likes, dislikes, personality, strengths, and weaknesses, you will discuss the various aspects of a career path that interests you. You may even want to include your career research paper in this section.

When reflecting on your writing, consider the following points:

When reflecting on your writing, consider the following points:

- What did you learn from this piece?
- What process was used to create this piece?

As you select the pieces you will include, you need to go back through each piece to make sure it is your best work. That might mean making additional changes and improvements to the pieces to make them as good as they can possibly be. Lastly, create each reflection on a separate document that follows the associated work in your digital portfolio.
