


Chiton



A long robe which was dyed in symbolic colors




Cothurni



Platform shoes used for style and to increase height




Parados



The ode that is sung by the chorus at the beginning of the play




Peripeteia



The reversal within the tragedy, an action that produces the opposite of what was intended




Anagnorisis



The moment of discovery




Hubris



Self- will, arrogance, extreme pride




Catharsis

The opening of the play where the characters as well as the situation are revealed




Scenes (Episodes)



The portion of the drama where the dialogue and events occur




Ode (Stasimon)
