
#### Introduction



In this interactivity, click on each of the markers to explore the different points of view that authors can use in literature.



#### **First-Person**



The character within the story is narrating the story. When the character narrates the story, they use pronouns such as;

Singular: I, me, my mine Plural: we, us, our, ours



### Third-Person



The narrator is a voice outside of the piece of literature. As an author tells a fictional story in the third person, they use pronouns such as;

Singular: he, him, his, she, her, hers, it, its

Plural: they, they, their, theirs




### **Third-Person Omniscient**



A voice from outside the story is able to tell the thoughts and actions of all of the characters within the story.



### **Third-Person Limited**



A voice from outside the story is able to tell the thoughts and actions of only one character.
