


Introduction


Linking Verb



This linking verb "links" the subject the *leader* to the subject complement *ambitious*.




Subject Complement



This subject complement describes the leader as ambitious.




Indirect Object



The indirect object us answers the question "To whom was the assignment given?" It is also between the verb and direct object assignment because it indirectly receives the action of the verb gave.



Direct Object



The direct object assignment answers "What was given?" It directly receives the action from the verb gave.
