The settings of gothic fiction are usually dark and foreboding. Stories take place in such ominous locations as eerie forests or haunted castles. Gothic settings are often secluded, such as isolated mountaintops separated from civilization. Gothic architecture, like that seen in medieval monasteries or fortresses, contributes to an atmosphere of mystery and suspense. With gothic fiction, the setting of the story becomes a character in and of itself, imposing ancestral curses, revealing hidden passageways, and otherwise threatening the protagonist with danger.



The Gothic Hero



The gothic hero is a type of antihero similar to the Byronic hero in that he or she is often brooding and passionate. But the gothic protagonist is also headstrong, an obstinate rebel who follows his or her own cause and pushes the limit while ignoring ominous signs. Thus, the protagonist is often physically or emotionally isolated from others, trapped in a secluded and dangerous location or suffering from psychological torment.



# Horror and Intense Emotion

# Supernatural and Inexplicable Events



True to the ideals of Romanticism, fiction of the gothic genre incorporates events and elements of the supernatural. You might encounter such supernatural creatures as ghosts, vampires, demons, or other monsters. Other seemingly inexplicable events often include mysterious deaths or disappearances. Sometimes the supernatural is eventually revealed to be the degradation of the protagonist's psychological state or perhaps the result of a scientific experiment gone wrong. More often though, the supernatural turns out to be what it seems: the characters' worst nightmare come true.
