

Conclusion

The concluding sentence wraps up your paragraph, usually in a clever and interesting way. It sums up your entire essay for the reader. The conclusion includes:

- **Reworded thesis:** You should write the thesis again in a different way. This reminds your audience of what you were trying to prove in our essay. It also serves as a checkpoint for you to make sure you have stayed on topic and focused.
- **Clincher sentence:** This makes the reader remember your essay.

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
