



### Nouns



#### Definition


words that name persons, places, things, or ideas

#### Examples

grandfather, Chicago, justice, computer, friend, Tiger Woods, book, Mexico



### Pronouns



#### Definition


words that take the place of a noun or other pronoun

#### Examples

I, you, they, my, her, we, us, them, anyone, all, many, myself, those, this, some, several, none



### Verbs



### Definition


words that express an action or a state of being

#### Examples

slide, run, remain, taste, is, are, have, feel, will be, jump, direct, smell, think



Adjectives



### Definition


modifiers that give information about a noun or pronoun

#### Examples

fluffy clouds, American theater, juicy grape, next year, eight weeks



### Adverbs



### Definition


modifiers that tell more about verbs, adjectives, and other adverbs

#### Examples

We *slowly* walked to school. *Suddenly* the rain started falling. The school day is *too* long.



### Prepositions



### Definition


words that connect nouns, pronouns, and phrases in a sentence to another word (forming a prepositional phrase)

#### Examples

The cat is *on* the table. The dog is *under* the table. You are leaning *against* the counter. You are texting *during* dinner.



Conjunctions



### Definition


words that join words or groups of words

### Examples

and, but, or, nor, yet, so, for, either ... or, neither ... nor, both ... and



Interjections



### Definition

words that express mild or strong emotion

### Examples

Aha, wow, oh, ugh, hey, yo, well
