


Record Your Sources



Take accurate notes and record sources.




Works Cited



Include a Works Cited or bibliography page, which is a formal listing of all sources referenced in your paper or project.




Quotes



Put direct quotes in quotations.



Paraphrase and Summarize



Put paraphrases and summaries in your own words, staying true to the original meaning but avoiding the original wording.




Always Cite



Always cite, or give credit, to the original source of any information or work.



Do Not Copy and Paste



Do not copy and paste information or a work from a website or online document.




Avoid Procrastination



Begin your research early to avoid rushing to meet a deadline. Procrastinating can cause unintentional plagiarism.



Use a Manual



Adhere to a standardized style guide or manual, such as the MLA (Modern Language Association) Manual for formatting and style.
