

Introduction



George Orwell uses several different kinds of satire in *Animal Farm*. In this interactivity, click on each of the bars in the accordion to learn more about each of these different types.




Exaggeration



To exaggerate is to make something bigger or more apparent than it is so that it seems ridiculous and the reader sees its faults.




Incongruity



Incongruity is to put something in a surrounding in which it is out of place so that the reader sees its absurdity.




Parody



To parody is to imitate a person, place, or thing in such a way that it is comical or insulting.




Reversal
