



### **Using Keywords From Previous Paragraphs**



You can create transitions between paragraphs by pulling keywords or phrases from the previous paragraph and reusing them in the beginning of the following paragraph. In the example below, notice the repetition of the word "reality."

#### Example:

... So, as August comes to an end, children begin to face a harsh <u>reality</u>.

And what is that <u>reality</u>? It is the fact that a long year of school will soon begin, and this event is unavoidable. . . .

### **Using Ideas From Previous Paragraphs**

You can create transitions between paragraphs by identifying main ideas from the previous paragraph and reusing them in the beginning of the following paragraph. In the example below, notice the repeated concept of freedom introduced in the previous paragraph.

#### Example:

... Finally teenagers could drive their own cars. They rejoiced in the ability to go wherever they pleased, whenever they pleased.

Their <u>newfound freedom</u>, however, turned out to be less fulfilling than they expected....
