

Incorrect:


Scientists now know that pollution **definately** contributes to coral bleaching.

Incorrect:


Policy makers are still asking what the implications of the research findings are?

Check to make sure that every sentence begins with a capital letter.

Incorrect:


the field of marine biology has advanced greatly due to Smith's contributions.

Incorrect:


Coral reefs make up diverse ecosystems, and are under threat of extinction.

Do you use apostrophes correctly to show possession?



Check to make sure you use apostrophes correctly to show possession.

Incorrect:


Womens' volunteer efforts have made significant improvement in reef restoration.

Correct:

Women's volunteer efforts have made significant improvement in reef restoration.



Are the appropriate nouns capitalized?



Check to make sure that appropriate nouns are capitalized.

Incorrect:


Some corals are able to adapt to cold Winter temperatures in january and february.

Correct:

Some corals are able to adapt to cold winter temperatures in January and February.



Do you misuse any commonly confused words?



Check to make sure you do not misuse any commonly confused words.

Incorrect:


Corals get **there** color primarily from the algae they consume.

Correct:

Corals get **their** color primarily from the algae they consume.



Do your subjects and verbs agree in number?



Check to make sure your subjects and verbs agree in number.

Incorrect:


The carbon <u>footprint</u> resulting from a person's recreational activities **cause** harm to coral reefs.

Correct:

The carbon <u>footprint</u> resulting from a person's recreational activities causes harm to coral reefs.



Do your pronouns agree with their antecedents?



Check to make sure your pronouns agree with their antecedents.

Incorrect:

When a <u>person</u> uses sunscreen, they may not realize how damaging the chemicals are to marine life.

Correct:


When a <u>person</u> uses sunscreen, **he or she** may not realize how damaging the chemicals are to marine life.

Correct:

When <u>people</u> use sunscreen, they may not realize how damaging the chemicals are to marine life.



Do you have any incomplete sentences?



Check to make sure you do not have any incomplete sentences.

Incorrect:


The Great Barrier Reef **located** off the coast of Australia.

Correct:

The Great Barrier Reef located off the coast of Australia is the world's largest coral reef.



Do you have any run-on sentences?



Check to make sure you do not have any run-on sentences.

Incorrect:

Nonprofit organizations have attempted to protect fragile reefs, **unfortunately**, their efforts have not been effective.

Correct:


Nonprofit organizations have attempted to protect fragile reefs; **unfortunately**, their efforts have not been effective.

Do you have any misplaced modifiers?



Check to make sure you do not have any misplaced modifiers.

Incorrect:

Towing nets over reefs, <u>corals</u> are damaged by fishermen.

Correct:

Corals are damaged by <u>fishermen</u> towing nets over reefs.
