#### **Create a Writing Portfolio**



A writing portfolio is an excellent endeavor if you are considering pursuing a future in writing. Collecting your best pieces into one portfolio will come in handy when potential schools and/or employers ask to see your writing samples. Your portfolio can utilize a print format, a digital format, or both.



#### **Enter a Writing Contest**



There are numerous writing contests held every year. If you are interested, ask your English instructor or guidance counselor to help you find one, or conduct your own Internet search. Make sure that your written work meets the requirements of the contest, and select contests that do not require entrance fees.



### **Submit Your Work to a Newspaper or Magazine**



Most places have local newspapers or literary magazines. One may even exist in your own school. Inquire about submitting your written work to a newspaper, magazine, or journal.



#### Showcase Your Work in a Literary Fair



The goal of most literary fairs is to promote appreciation of writing and literature among the general public. Check with your school English department or with local museums and bookstores to see if there are any literary fairs (or literary events) that are looking to showcase local talent.



#### Participate in a Writers' Conference



A writers' conference is usually sponsored by a writing group or association for the purpose of developing writing skills and offering professional support. By participating in such a conference, you may be able to share your work with more experienced writers who can offer feedback. You can also attend workshops to improve your writing or read the work of others to gain inspiration.
