Content	The blog entries include well-developed ideas and descriptions, and they include the required number of observations (three per entry) about the <i>Odyssey</i> . The blog entries include at least one Homeric simile and one Homeric epithet.	The blog entries include the correct number of observations (three per entry), but the information lacks well-developed ideas about the <i>Odyssey</i> . The blog entries include at least one Homeric simile and one Homeric epithet.	The blog entries include less than the required number of observations (three per entry) and contain no original ideas. The blog entries include at least one Homeric simile or one Homeric epithet.	The blog entries contain information that is off-topic, incorrect, or irrelevant. The blog entries do not include Homeric similes or epithets.
Voice	The blog entries are written using the first-person point of view and engage the reader with an expressive and unique perspective. The blog entries are entertaining to read. The blog entries are written using the first-person point of view, but the blog entries do not include engaging language.	The blog entries are not written in the first person point of view and the entries are not written in a narrative format.
Image Use	Each blog entry is accompanied by an image that is properly formatted, interesting, and related to the content in the entry.	Each blog entry is accompanied by an image; however, one or more of the images is not appropriate to the content presented in an entry.	One or more of the blog entries is missing an image.	There are no images provided with the blog entries.
Literary Support	The blog entries integrate personal reflections with complete information from the epic.	The blog entries include personal reflections combined with some information from the epic.	The blog entries use some information from the epic, but no additional reflections.	The blog entries use no information from the epic.
Clarity and Mechanics	The blog entries are clear and easy to read. They contain no grammatical or spelling errors. The tone is friendly and inviting.
