
#### Introduction



Their relationship seems like paradise so far, but Act III is about to present a turning point that threatens to unravel the happiness that they have shared so far. ### Act III, Scene i




In the first scene, you will notice that a slew of action occurs. What happens to Mercutio, and how is Romeo indirectly responsible? What does Romeo do to Tybalt? How does the prince react to Romeo's actions?

### Act III, Scene ii




In the second scene, Juliet is anxiously waiting for news of Romeo when her nurse comes in and tells her about the unfortunate deaths. What is Juliet's reaction to the news? How do the words that she uses to refer to Romeo reveal her feelings?

#### Act III, Scene iii




In the third scene, you find Romeo hiding in Friar Laurence's cell. What news does the friar give to Romeo? Is Romeo happy with this news? When the nurse comes in and tells Romeo that Juliet "weeps and weeps," what does Romeo attempt to do? How does Friar Laurence react? What is Friar Laurence's solution to this terrible situation?

#### Act III, Scene iv




The fourth scene is very short, but it is hugely important. Right after Romeo makes plans to visit Juliet before leaving the city, Paris pays a visit to Capulet, Juliet's father. What decision does Capulet make about his daughter? What is going to happen on Thursday morning? This new upcoming event certainly does not fit into Romeo's plans.

#### Act III, Scene v



In the final scene, Romeo and Juliet are sharing a tender moment together in her room when they are interrupted by the nurse telling them that Lady Capulet is coming to the chamber. What "glad tidings" does Lady Capulet bring Juliet? How does Juliet react? How does Capulet behave when Juliet talks to him? Notice that in order to escape Capulet's decision, Juliet pleads with her father first, then her mother, and finally the nurse. How does the nurse react? Whom does Juliet decide to go see in order to escape this terrible problem?
