




Je and J'



Je/J'

This personal pronoun can be *je* or *j'*. If the pronoun I occurs in front of a verb that begins with a vowel, drop the 'e' and use an apostrophe.

For example, if you want to say, "I come from France," you would convey, "Je viens de France." Notice that *je* was used in the sentence because 'viens' is a verb that begins with a consonant. Conversely, if you want to say, "I have homework," you would convey, "J'ai des devoirs." Notice that *j'* was used in the sentence because 'ai' is a verb that begins with a vowel.
