
Introduction

Meaning



On means "one" or "we." Really, it is a generic way to say that somebody is doing something, without referring to a specific person. For example, you may hear someone say, "On parle français ici." This translates to, "One speaks French here," or "We speak French here." Notice how these sentences do not refer to anyone in particular.




Conjugation



Take a moment to review singular and plural pronouns. *On* is conjugated just like *il* and *elle*. It is third person, singular.

Feedback when correct:


You selected the correct response. Aimer becomes aime, because you drop the –er and add 'e' to conjugate a verb in the third person singular necessary for on.

Practice Two



How do you conjugate the verb *jouer* so that it translates to "one plays"? Click on the correct answer, then click **SUBMIT**.

Feedback when correct: You selected the correct response. Jouer becomes joue, because you drop the –er and add 'e' to conjugate a verb in the third person singular necessary for on.

Feedback when incorrect: You did not select the correct response. Jouer becomes joue, because you drop the –er and add 'e' to conjugate a verb in the third person singular necessary for on.
