
## Introduction



Click the **NEXT** button to explore examples of how to use negation in the future tense.



#### Step One




Similar to the rules for negation you have learned about in previous modules, when making a sentence negative in the near future tense, **ne...pas** goes around the conjugated verb in the sentence.

Take a moment to look at this example. Identify the conjugated verb in the sentence, *Je vais manger la pizza*. Type your answer in the space provided. Then, click **SUBMIT**.

Feedback: The sentence *Je vais manger la pizza*, translates to, *I am going to eat pizza*. The conjugated verb in the sentence is *vais*.



#### Step Two




Now that you know *vais* is the conjugated verb, make the sentence negative by putting *ne...pas* around it. See if you can figure out how the sentence should change in the negative. Specifically, you want it to say, *I am not going to eat pizza*. Select the correct sentence, and then, click *SUBMIT*.

Feedback: The sentence in its negative form is *Je* **ne** vais **pas** manger la pizza. You put *ne...pas* around the conjugated verb "vais".



#### Verbs Beginning with a Vowel



Do you remember how to change *ne...pas* if the verb begins with a vowel? You are correct if you said *ne* loses the *e*, and then contracts with the verb. Take a moment to look at the example, *Nous n'allons pas danser*. Notice how *danser* is not conjugated, so *ne...pas* cannot go around that verb, but rather, it goes around *allons*.
