

While the capital of Switzerland is Bern, the most populated city is Zurich. Another popular city is Geneva, which sits in the southwest corner of the country, by Lake Geneva, or Lac Léman, as you would say in French. Lake Geneva is the largest body of water in Switzerland, and has three different sections: the Upper Lake, The Large Lake, and the Small Lake. It is crescent-shaped, and is the location of many sporting events, including high speed catamarans.



Switzerland is a Federal Republic, and is formally known as a confederation. It is divided into twenty-six cantons, and is ruled by the President of the Confederation. Unlike all of its neighbors, Switzerland is not a member of the European Union. In regards to foreign affairs, Switzerland is known for its neutrality.

Matterhorn is one of the highest mountains in Switzerland; has pyramid-like peak

Castle Chillon is on Lac Léman; defense castle

One famous landmark in Switzerland is the Matterhorn, one of the highest mountains in the Alps, and in Europe. It straddles the border of southern Switzerland and northern Germany, and is well known for its symmetrical pyramid-like peak. Another landmark is the castle, Chillon, which sits on Lac Léman. Chillon sits on an island in the lake, which provides natural protection to the country. In fact, it has acted as a defense castle in Europe since the 12th century.
