

### Introduction



#### **Federalists**




During the election of 1800, the Federalist Party was led by John Adams and Alexander Hamilton. Federalists believed in a strong national or federal government. Supported by bankers and northeastern business interests, they supported commercial economic policies and public improvements, and generally sided with England. In the election of 1800, their presidential candidate was the current President, John Adams.

### **Democratic-Republicans**



The Democratic-Republicans were led by Thomas Jefferson and James Madison during the election of 1800. This political party emerged from the ideas of the Anti-Federalists and believed in a weak federal government. They were supported by farmers, artisans, and frontier settlers mostly in the southern states. They supported agricultural economic policies and sided with France. In the election of 1800, their presidential candidate was Thomas Jefferson. Jefferson won the election and became the third president.
