






Roman arches




The ancient Greeks and Romans valued education and learning; they wrote poetry, plays, and history




The Greek mathematician Euclid is shown holding a compass




The Roman scientist Ptolemy is shown discussing his geocentric (earth-centered) theory of the universe




Two ancient Greek philosophers: Plato, on the left, and his student Aristotle, on the right
