Jupiter




Jupiter was the Roman ruler of the gods. He was god of the sky, lightening, and the heavens. His symbols included the lightning bolt and the eagle.

Greek equivalent: Zeus

Juno




Juno was the Roman goddess of marriage and married women. She was the wife of Jupiter. Her symbol was the peacock. Juno was also the patroness of the city of Rome and the Roman Empire.

Greek equivalent: Hera

Neptune



Neptune was the Roman god of the sea, water, and horses. He was the brother of Jupiter and Pluto. His symbols included the trident (a three-pronged fish spear), dolphin, and horse.

Greek equivalent: Poseidon

Minerva



Minerva was the Roman goddess of war (domestic protection), peace, and wisdom. She was the favored daughter of Jupiter. Her symbol was the owl.

Greek equivalent: Athena

Venus



Venus was the Roman goddess of love and beauty. She was the daughter of Jupiter. Roman mythology credits her with being the mother of Rome through ancestry. Her symbols included the dove, rose, and myrtle wreath.

Greek equivalent: Aphrodite

Diana



Diana was the Roman goddess of hunting, wild animals, and the Moon. She was the offspring of Jupiter and Latona (a minor goddess), and the twin sister of the god Apollo. Her symbols included a bow and arrow, deer, and the Moon.

Greek equivalent: Artemis

Apollo




Apollo was the Roman god of the Sun, poetry, music, and the oracles. He was the offspring of Jupiter and Latona (a minor goddess), and the twin brother of the goddess Diana. His symbols included the lyre and the laurel wreath.

Greek equivalent: Apollo

Pluto



Pluto was the god of the underworld, the dead, and riches. He was the brother of Jupiter and Neptune. His symbols included Cerberus (a three-headed guard dog), a pronged scepter, and the cornucopia.

Greek equivalent: Hades
