

Course Components and Navigation

World History II

After accessing the course content from your course management system, you will see links available in a list format for you to use throughout the course. The structure of each course includes the following items:

- **Course Information** (for students)
- **Instructor Guide:** a collection of documents to assist the instructor with the instruction of the course.
- **Developmental Module:** in this supplementary module, students will find "how to's" which may help them as they navigate through the online course. These will include content-related items, as well as technical items.
- **Web-Based and Mobile Applications:** a link to a list of applications associated with the course.
- **Course Modules**

Each course module includes the following components:

- **Module Overview**
 - Module Title and Introduction
 - Pre-Assessment
 - Key Vocabulary
- **Topics** (multiple based on content)
- **Module Summary**
- **Module Authentic Assessment and Test Bank:** see the Assessments document for more information.

From inside a topic, use the navigation bar to move to each part of the lesson viewing them in the following order:

- **Introduction:** includes the title for the topic, a brief description of the content to be studied, and any essential questions.
- **Warm-Up:** an activity to capture the students' attention.
- **Content:** new content presented to the learner which is organized meaningfully, and typically is explained and then demonstrated; students are presented with a variety of opportunities to practice newly learned skills or concepts in a non-graded format.
- **Application:** an activity used as a means to thoroughly and methodically analyze student accomplishments against the curricular objectives; it is intended for students to submit work to the teacher and the teacher to grade the assignment and provide individualized feedback to each student.
- **Summary:** the summary should answer the essential questions that were referenced in the topic introduction and provide a connection to the next topic; additionally, other enrichment/extension activities or a list of URL's for activities or resources can be provided.
