

#### Introduction




In colonial Latin America, there were five classes of people. Each class had more rights and privileges than the one below it - and the one at the top had the most rights and privileges of all.


### Espanoles



The 'Espanoles' were at the top of caste system. These were people of "pure Spanish blood"—which was a mixture of native Iberian, Celtic, Goth, Visigoth, Teuton, North African Arab, Moor, and a few others—who were born in Spain. The viceroys, the colonial leaders, and the colonial officers were in this group.




# Creoles



The Creoles were people of "pure Spanish blood" who were born in the Americas.




## Mestizos



The Mestizos were people of mixed European and Native American heritage.




## Native American/Indigenous
